Subject: Subject: A. 20-09-014 ALJ Ruling Setting Protest And Protest Response Due Dates, And Noticing Prehearing Conference

To Parties and Other Interested Persons in Proceeding A. 20-09-014:

On September 28, 2020, Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) filed the instant application in conformance with Commission Decision (D.) 18-10-019, requesting expedited Commission authorization for approval to adjust rates to address an undercollection in the Power Charge Indifference Adjustment Undercollection Balancing Account. As requested by PG&E in the application, due to the expedited nature of this proceeding the protest period will be shortened and protests must be filed on or before October 19, 2020. Replies to protests shall be due October 23, 2020.

Notice is hereby given, a telephonic prehearing conference (PHC) will be held on Friday, October 30, 2020, at 1:30 p.m. The PHC will address the scope and schedule for the proceeding, establish the service list, and address other procedural matters that may arise. PG&E should meet and confer with those parties that file a protest to the application or entities intending to request party status and, to the extent possible, resolve conflicts in proposed schedules, scope of issues, and/or other matters prior to the PHC.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company shall cause a copy of this ruling to be served expeditiously on all entities to whom service of its application was provided.

The Docket Office shall formerly file this e-mail ruling.

ALJ Toy,

PG&E respectfully renews its request for a ruling setting October 13th as the deadline for parties to file protests. The CCAs and others were aware of the expected filing date in advance, as well as the proposed deadline for protests included in the application. Since its filing, PG&E has been providing responses to data requests on an accelerated timeframe in order to facilitate meeting the October 13th deadline. Moreover, a 30-day protest period would make it virtually impossible to meet the 60-day deadline for a final decision established in D.18-10-019. Under D.18-10-019, a final decision is required by

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November 27, 2020. For these reasons, PG&E continues to believe that an October 13 deadline for protests in this proceeding is appropriate and necessary to meet the deadlines established by the Commission.
